Further, he is a certified trainer with the International Labour Organization's (ILO) Start and Improve Your Business (SIYB) Programme. Mr. Bartholomew also played a vital role in the development of the Cabinet-approved National Policy for Co-operatives and the attainment of membership by the College with the International Co-operative Business Education Consortium (ICBEC), and serves as a member of the Working Committee of the ICBEC.

Insight into the management of co-operatives, both financial and non-financial, is provided in all co-operative studies courses. Through these courses, foundational tools and perspectives to improve efficiency and effectiveness in co-operative service are provided. The department offers the Bachelor of Arts (BA), Associate of Arts, (AA), and Certificate in Credit Union Management (CCUM). Our programmes are accredited by the Accreditation Council of Trinidad and Tobago (ACTT) and are supported by the International Co-operative Business Educators Consortium (ICBEC). Highly competent sector experts, who all remain at the cutting edge of co-operative development, deliver all modules.

Programme Description

The vision of the Co-operative Studies programme is to promote excellence in the field of Co-operatives. It is geared towards preparing students for professional and managerial employment in related fields. The programme encourages students to pursue higher academic learning.

The CCLCS offers the following:

- 1. **Accelerated Practitioner's Certificate:** A fast track 12-credit certificate in 15 weeks where credits earned are transferrable to the bachelor's programme.
- 2. **The Certificate programme** offers applicants a competency-based foundation to be able to operate in the world of work. The credits earned are transferrable to the Bachelor's degree programme at any time.
- 3. **The Diploma programme** offers graduates an intermediate competency-based insight with dedicated outcomes in diverse environments set at the individual, community and regional levels. The credits earned are transferrable to the Bachelor's degree programme at any time
- 4. **The Associate degree programme** offers graduates the cutting-edge skills that allow for effective functioning in the field. The credits earned are transferrable to the Bachelor's degree programme at any time.
- 5. **The Bachelor's degree programme** offers graduates business, technical and knowledge-based skills. This degree is ideally suited for all stakeholders where applicants can start at any level (Certificate, Diploma, Associate or Bachelors).
